Notes. In pronouncing the names of the letters, the *is* may be pronounced either as long English *is*, so that ϕ would sound like “fie,” or else as long English *es*, so that ϕ would sound like “fee.” The *es* are pronounced like English long *as*, so η is pronounced “Ayta” and ω is called “omayga.”

Note that many Greek capitals look identical to English capitals, although not always the one you’d expect. For instance, capital η is *H* and capital ρ is *P*.
