Notes. In pronouncing the names of the letters, the *i*s may be pronounced either as long English *i*s, so that ϕ would sound like "fie," or else as long English *e*s, so that ϕ would sound like "fee." The *e*s are pronounced like English long *a*s, so η is pronounced "Ayta" and ω is called "omayga."

Note that many Greek capitals look identical to English capitals, although not always the one you'd expect. For instance, capital η is H and capital ρ is P.
